Garner—an invariably engaging speaker—is the editor in chief of *Black's Law Dictionary* and the author of multiple books including *Garner's Modern English Usage* and two titles co-written with the late U.S. Supreme Court Justice Antonin Scalia: *Reading Law: The Interpretation of Legal Texts* and *Making Your Case: The Art of Persuading Judges*. Karolyne and Bryan Garner are wonderful friends, and I'm grateful they cleared their calendars to be here.

We are fortunate to have attorney and author Joseph Jaworski, founder and chairman of Generon International and the Global Leadership Initiative, as our General Session Luncheon keynote speaker. Jaworski began his career at Bracewell and in 1980 founded the American Leadership Forum, a non-governmental organization dedicated to strengthening collaborative civic leadership. He later joined the Royal Cutch/Shell Group of companies in London and was head of Shell's renowned team of scenario planners. His most recent book is *Source: The Inner Path of Knowledge Creation*.




